# Residence Life Mission & Goals

# Residency Agreement

---

LBC views community living as an essential part of a student's college learning experience. Therefore, **every full-time traditional undergraduate student is expected to live in College-owned housing during their entire undergraduate experience at LBC** unless they meet the qualifications, and have been granted permission in writing by Residence Life, to be released from the Residency Agreement and live off campus.

Release from the Residency Agreement can be granted to incoming students who will be living with their parent(s) or legal guardian(s) at their permanent home address within forty (40) miles of the College, with a spouse and/or children, or who are at least twenty-three (23) years of age by the start of the Fall semester.

# Residence Halls

---

The following slides will introduce you to the first year housing options on campus.

All residence halls house male and female students in sections separated by locked doors.

The cost of a double room is \$1,850.00 per semester.

# All rooms include the following:

---

- Wifi
- Air conditioning & heating (do not bring a personal air conditioner or space heater!)
- \$60 pre-loaded to your laundry account each semester; laundry is located in each building
- XL twin bed
- Wardrobe or closet
- Dresser
- Desk & desk chair

*\*ADA compliant rooms are available in each building. Please contact [dso@lbc.edu](mailto:dso@lbc.edu) if you need any type of housing accommodation. All buildings have an elevator.*



## East Hall

East Hall was built in 2015 and houses 115 male and female students in double and triple rooms.

Students in each of the five (5) hallways share a community-style bathroom and a lounge. Each section houses up to twenty-three (23) students.

Hallways are connected by larger common spaces that are shared by the entire building. Each hallway is designated for either male or female resident students.

Five Resident Assistants serve this building.



# Peterson Hall

Peterson Hall is the largest Residence Hall on campus. This suite-style building houses 194 male and female residents.

Each 8-person suite has two full bathrooms, a small lounge, and four double rooms. Three lounges, one on each floor, allow for larger group gatherings and community outside of the sections.

Twelve Resident Assistants serve in this building.



# Weber Hall

Weber Hall houses 112 male and female students. Each hall has a community-style bathroom shared by up to 14 residents.

Four smaller lounges connect each hallway and are accessible only to the residents of those hallways.

Two larger lounges, one with a stove/oven available to students for cooking, are available for larger gatherings with students from throughout the building.

Eight Resident Assistants serve this building.





# Housing Accommodations

Students requesting housing accommodations for medical or disability-related needs, such as a medically-necessary single room or service animal, must contact the Disability Services Office ([dso@lbc.edu](mailto:dso@lbc.edu)) to begin the request process.

# Selecting Your Housing & Meal Plan

- Complete your housing application in the [LBC StarRez Housing portal](#) beginning April 15th, 2022
- Select your roommate using the roommate matching feature or link with any roommate of your choice
- Select your room after May 10th; if you have paired with a roommate, your “group leader” will select your room, so make sure you are in communication with each other!
- Once you are in a room, you can select your meal plan; Charger’s Choice is the default meal plan for students
- View your housing assignment and roommate by logging into your LBC StarRez account at any time
- Connect with your roommate
- Plan for the big move! New students will move into their residence halls on Friday, August 26

# Residency Agreement Release

Students can apply to be released from the Residency Agreement through the Star-Rez housing application available on LBC Mobile and the [Student Portal](#).

**New students** who are seeking approval to live off campus must fill out the approval form before August 1. Late enrollment students should talk to the office of Residence Life as soon as possible, whether they are seeking on- or off-campus housing.
