

COVID-19 Remote Learning Guidelines

Global – Fall 2023

Definitions

Remote learning means that students will participate in live, synchronous residencies, using technology and will be expected to meet attendance and participation requirements as set forth by their professor(s). Remote learners should:

- Keep their camera on during Zoom sessions and actively engage with the class and professor. Class should be the sole focus of the student while attending remotely. It is not acceptable to attend class remotely while at work or driving in a car.
- Set aside a quiet and private space, conducive for learning.
- Have access to reliable, high-speed internet.
- Own a working desktop or laptop. Students may not attend class remotely on a cell phone except for rare circumstances when it is a last resort.

Remote Learning Requests

Temporary remote learning will be made available for students who have tested positive for COVID-19. Remote learners must self-identify by disclosing a positive COVID-19 test result to their professor(s). Professors may ask for proof of a positive COVID-19 test result.

Students who have tested positive for COVID-19 5 days or less in advance of a residency, should contact their professor(s) to: 1) disclose a positive COVID-19 test result, and 2) request a Zoom link.

Students who have tested positive for COVID-19 6-10 days in advance of a residency may attend residency in person with a medical grade mask if they are fever free or their symptoms are improving.

If students have an exposure to COVID-19, they should mask (medical grade mask) for 10 days following their last exposure date. Students may test on day 5 after their exposure to ensure they are not an asymptomatic carrier if desired. Student may attend residency with a mask.

Students who are experiencing flu-like symptoms should always test for COVID-19 before attending a residency.
